Mayor Farrell introduced Chief Davenport who explained the reaccreditation certification process through the New Jersey State Association of Chiefs of Police and introduced Captain Harry Delgado, who was in attendance to award the Sea Girt Police Department with its reaccreditation certificate. Captain Delgado is representing the New Jersey State Association of Chiefs of Police and is the Program Director for the state accreditation program. Captain Delgado noted that the Sea Girt Police Department, under the command of Chief Davenport, is one of only a few Departments in the State that have qualified for reaccreditation for the second time. He commended Chief Davenport for his leadership and Sgt. DeMillio for his outstanding work during the reaccreditation process.

B. Ordinances – Introduction

1. Ordinance No. 16-2018: The Mayor to read the said Ordinance by Title:

ORDINANCE NO. 16-2018

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND AND SUPPLEMENT SECTION 12-2, CONSTRUCTION PROCEDURE AND SITE REGULATION, SUBSECTION 12-2.2 ADDITIONAL REGULATIONS OF CHAPTER XII, BUILDING AND HOUSING IN THE BOROUGH OF SEA GIRT, COUNTY OF MONMOUTH

BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF SEA GIRT AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. Section 12-2.2.j.2. *Additional Regulations, Use of Power Tools* is hereby supplemented as follows:

c. In the absence of a permanent connection to the power grid, property owner or his designated representative shall provide a temporary connection to the power grid to provide power to the site during the period of construction, repair or alteration of buildings in excess of 300 square feet.

SECTION 2. *Violations and penalties.* Any person who shall violate any of the provisions of this Chapter shall, upon conviction, be subject to the penalties as provided in Chapter 1, Section 1-5 entitled "General Penalty." Each day of violation shall constitute a separate offense.

SECTION 3. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

SECTION 4. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or portion of this ordinance is for any reason held to be invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall

be deemed a separate, distinct, and independent provision, and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions hereof.

2. Ordinance No. 17-2018: The Mayor to read the said Ordinance by Title:

ORDINANCE NO. 17-2018

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND AND SUPPLEMENT CHAPTER XVII, ZONING, ARTICLE 17-2, DEFINITIONS; ARTICLE 17-4, SCHEDULE OF LIMITATIONS AND ARTICLE 17-5, GENERAL REGULATIONS, OF THE BOROUGH CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF SEA GIRT

BE IT ORDAINED by the Borough Council of the Borough of Sea Girt, County of Monmouth, as follows:

SECTION 1. Article 17-2, DEFINITIONS, is hereby supplemented as follows:

House of Worship and similar places of worship: any building where congregations gather for prayer

Schools: institution for the purpose of general academic instruction and accredited by the New Jersey Department of Education not operated for profit

SECTION 2. Article 17-4, SCHEDULE OF LIMITATIONS; CONFORMANCE WITH CHAPTER is hereby revised and supplemented as follows:

- a. *District 1 East, 1 West and 4 Single Family: sections entitled Purpose, Permitted Use On and/or In Building, Area and Yard Requirements are hereby amended; section entitled Conditional Uses is hereby added.*

SECTION 3. Article 17-5, GENERAL REGULATIONS, is hereby supplemented as follows:

- a. *17-5.26 Schools, (as defined in § 17-2 Definitions) churches and similar places of worship, parish houses, convents, church schools and libraries that are owned and operated by duly incorporated religious organizations shall be permitted in all zones of the Borough of Sea Girt, subject to the following limitations and requirements:*

buildings. One (1) parish house, convent, church school and church library may be constructed as part of a building used as a church or similar place of worship or in combination or singly as accessory buildings.

- c. The minimum front yard depth shall be fifty (50) feet.
- d. The minimum side yard shall be twenty (20) feet on both sides.
- e. The minimum rear yard depth shall be fifty (50) feet.
- f. The minimum street frontage shall be one hundred twenty five (125) feet.
- g. The maximum building height shall be two (2) stories, not to exceed fifty (50) feet to the highest point of any building, exclusive of chimneys, steeples and similar items.
- h. Parking areas shall be located only in the side yards and rear yard and not in the buffer strips required by paragraph h. below.
- i. Buffer strips ten (10) feet in width with planting, as indicated by the location and existing trees and undergrowth, shall be maintained all along the side lines and rear line. No trees shall be removed in the buffer strips unless approved by the Planning Board.
- j. There shall be a minimum of one (1) separate entrance and one (1) separate exit from and to a public street, collector road, and arterial road.
- k. No building permit shall be issued unless a site plan has been approved in writing by the Planning Board.
- l. The Planning Board, in making its determination, shall be guided by the following standards in order that such uses may be properly related to the orderly and harmonious development of the community.
 1. The proper relationship of the particular structures and other features shown on the site plan to one another and to present and proposed structures and other features in the area.
 2. The proper relationship of parking areas, driveways and approaches to roadways and traffic flow on roadways and on private or public property in the area.
 3. The proper relationship of structures and other features to the contours of the land.
 4. The proper maintenance of natural features, trees and foliage.
 5. The proper development of buffer strips as required by paragraph h. above.
 6. Such matters as relate to the planning and physical development of the Borough of Sea Girt.

SECTION 4. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

SECTION 5. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or portion of this ordinance is for any reason held to be invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct, and independent provision, and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions hereof.

9. **ADMINISTRATOR REPORTS/DISCUSSION**

• **NEW RECYCLING REGULATIONS IMPOSED BY THE STATE, EFFECTIVE IMMEDIATELY:** Due to recently imposed State regulations, effective immediately, plastic bags can no longer be accepted nor can they be dumped in the recycling bins at the Borough Yard. If recyclables are conveyed to the yard in a plastic bag, you must dump the recyclables into the bin; the plastic bag should be re-used by the resident or disposed of as trash. Please use containers no larger than 32-gallon for the disposal of all recyclable material. Any recyclables that are placed in bags cannot be collected.

- Pizza boxes are now considered trash due to the presence of food residue. They should be disposed of with household trash.
- The Recycling Center is under video surveillance. Fines shall be issued for any illegal dumping.

The Mayor & Council appreciate your cooperation in this effort to comply with the new State Regulations.

• **2018-2019 PROPERTY TAX BILLING DELAYED**

▪ Due to the last minute revisions to the State budget and resulting delay in the County certification of the tax rates, the mailing of tax bills was delayed. The due date will be extended by the statutorily required minimum of 25 days from the date of mailing; therefore, August 25 becomes the due date. However, since this falls on a Saturday, the due date automatically defaults to the next business day, August 27.

• **REMINDERS FOR BEACH PATRONS AND GUESTS:** While enjoying our boardwalk and beach, your compliance with the following is appreciated:

- May 15 to September 15: bike riding on the boardwalk is limited to the hours of 5 AM to 9 AM only;
- Dogs are not permitted on the boardwalk at any time;
- *Unleashed* dogs are not permitted on the beach at any time;
- March 15 to September 30: dogs are not permitted on borough beaches
- **NO SMOKING ON THE BEACH OR BOARDWALK AT ANY TIME** (Borough Ordinance No. 10-2014)

ENFORCEMENT NOTICE: In order to maintain the quality of life for residents and visitors, the Sea Girt Police Department has a zero tolerance policy for these and all Borough Ordinance violations. Please be courteous and respect our rules. Thank you for your anticipated cooperation.

• **Baltimore Park Rehabilitation Project** is anticipated to begin on or about September 5, 2018; the park will be *closed* during construction, which is estimated to take 6 to 8 weeks.

10. **QPA REPORTS** (of activity since previous Council Meeting): None

11. **COUNCIL REPORTS:** Councilpersons Foley and Morris had no reports.

- Councilman Meixsell reported that the Borough’s recent 5K Race had 1,900 adults participate and 250 children; the Recreation Program should receive approximately \$35,000 from race proceeds to support programs and an additional \$2,700 in donations was received. He noted that this is a great community event and thanked all involved.
- Councilman Mulroy reported as follows:
 - 5K was a great event;
 - Beach – due to uneven weather, there were several low or no beach sales days; despite the weather, revenue is ahead of last year at this time by approximately \$3,000; lifeguards have been busy; in a recent swim event, our guards placed 1, 2, 3, 4 and 11; he further noted that they are great swimmers.
- Council President Fetzer reported as follows:
 - Labor relations – continuing on with PBA negotiations;
 - SMMUA – discussion regarding the replacement of the Brielle water tank and noted that the plan is for the Borough participate on a pro-rated basis based on the benefit to be received;
 - Work Quality Accountability Act is required by State with deliverables due starting on October 18;
 - CMMS: we are applying for a grant in the amount of \$100,000 to fund the cost of implementing the required Asset Management Plan through the NJ IBank (formerly NJEIT).
- Mayor Farrell thanked residents for their patience during some delays in processing applications for zoning and construction permits; part of the reason for the delay is that we are closely reviewing all applications and requiring strict ordinance compliance *before* permits will be issued.

13. **PUBLIC PARTICIPATION ON ANY SUBJECT:** The Mayor opened the meeting to the public for comments.

The following persons commented on a July 19-20 incident at the Parker House or the seasonal operation of the establishment including the impact of the additional traffic on the area; Chief Davenport advised that the July 19-20 matter is still under investigation by the Prosecutor's Office; therefore, neither he nor the Council will have any further comments:

Unknown gentlemen commented on the failure to control the occupancy at the Parker House; Councilman Meixsell responded that the occupancy numbers have been determined by the State Fire Inspector, not the Borough;

Mary Scheiderman, Baltimore Blvd., suggested that the Borough should have a community pool;

Judy Tolchin, MCL Director, noted that the Library is run by a commission on a much lower rate than a local library can be operated; the Library Commission is an advocate for all residents of Monmouth County; she also commented that she believed the Spring Lake Library must run at a higher budget than Sea Girt currently pays to the County; Councilwoman Morris responded that we have performed our due diligence and the Spring Lake Library 2017 levy was approximately \$1.2M, with expenses to operate the Library verified at just under \$290,000; so the remaining funds not spent on the Library accrue to the Borough (SL). Mayor Farrell noted that the Monmouth County Library system has been an asset to the Community, but the Borough (SG) could do better operating its own.

Sue Blasi, New York Blvd., stated that she is in favor of the plan to leave the Monmouth County Library; she also noted that the Shade Tree Commission had a long detailed discussion on the proposed Ordinance regarding tree preservation that resulted in the preparation of the draft that was considered this evening;

John Ward, Trenton Blvd. commented that the Master Plan Re-examination Report should be posted on website; the Administrator responded that the Report is available the on website; he also suggested that proposed Ordinances should be posted separately on the website with as explanatory statement;

Jim Skidmore, Ocean Avenue, asked when plan for Carriage Way will be available; Mayor Farrell indicated that it should be available on September 10;

Sharon Kregg, Brooklyn Blvd., commented that too many people are in The Parker House; the permitted hours of 8 am to 6:00 pm for construction is too long and it should be cut back to 5:00 pm; is in favor of the Library withdrawing from MCL as its operation as a local library can be geared to our residents;

Phillip Vasan, Ocean Avenue, noted that he is supportive of neighbors' complaining about The Parker House; and noted that there should be discussion among residents to suggest solutions.

There being no further comments, and by consensus, the public hearing was closed. Mayor Farrell advised that Council has matters to discuss in Executive Session, and requested a motion to adjourn for purposes of the discussion; he further noted that action may be taken by Council upon return to public session and that the public is invited to remain outside and may return to the meeting room when the Council returns to public session. **UPON MOTION** of Councilwoman Morris, seconded by Councilman Meixsell, carried, that the following **Resolution No. 140-2018** be and the same is hereby adopted:

WHEREAS, Section 8 of the Open Public Meeting Act, N.J.S.A. 10:4-12 permits the exclusion of the public from a meeting in certain circumstances; and,

WHEREAS, this public body is of the opinion that such circumstances presently exist.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Borough Council of the Borough of Sea Girt, County of Monmouth, State of New Jersey, as follows:

1. The public shall be excluded from discussion of and action upon the hereinafter specified subject matter.
2. The general nature of the subject matter(s) to be discussed is as follows:
 - a. Ira Walker v. the Borough of Sea Girt, F. Ken Farrell, Individually and in his official capacity as Mayor; James Quigley, Individually and in his official capacity as Zoning and Code Enforcement Official (*Note: complaints against Mayor Farrell and Mr. Quigley were dismissed by the Court on the motions for summary judgment filed by their respective Counsels*);
 - b. Kenneth Hagel v. Kevin Davenport, Individually and in his official capacity as Chief of the Borough of Sea Girt Police Department; the Borough of Sea Girt Police Department and the Borough of Sea Girt;
 - c. Potential litigation.
3. It is anticipated at this time that the subject matters will be made public, if and when, confidentiality is no longer necessary. Action may be taken upon return to public session.
4. This Resolution shall take effect immediately.

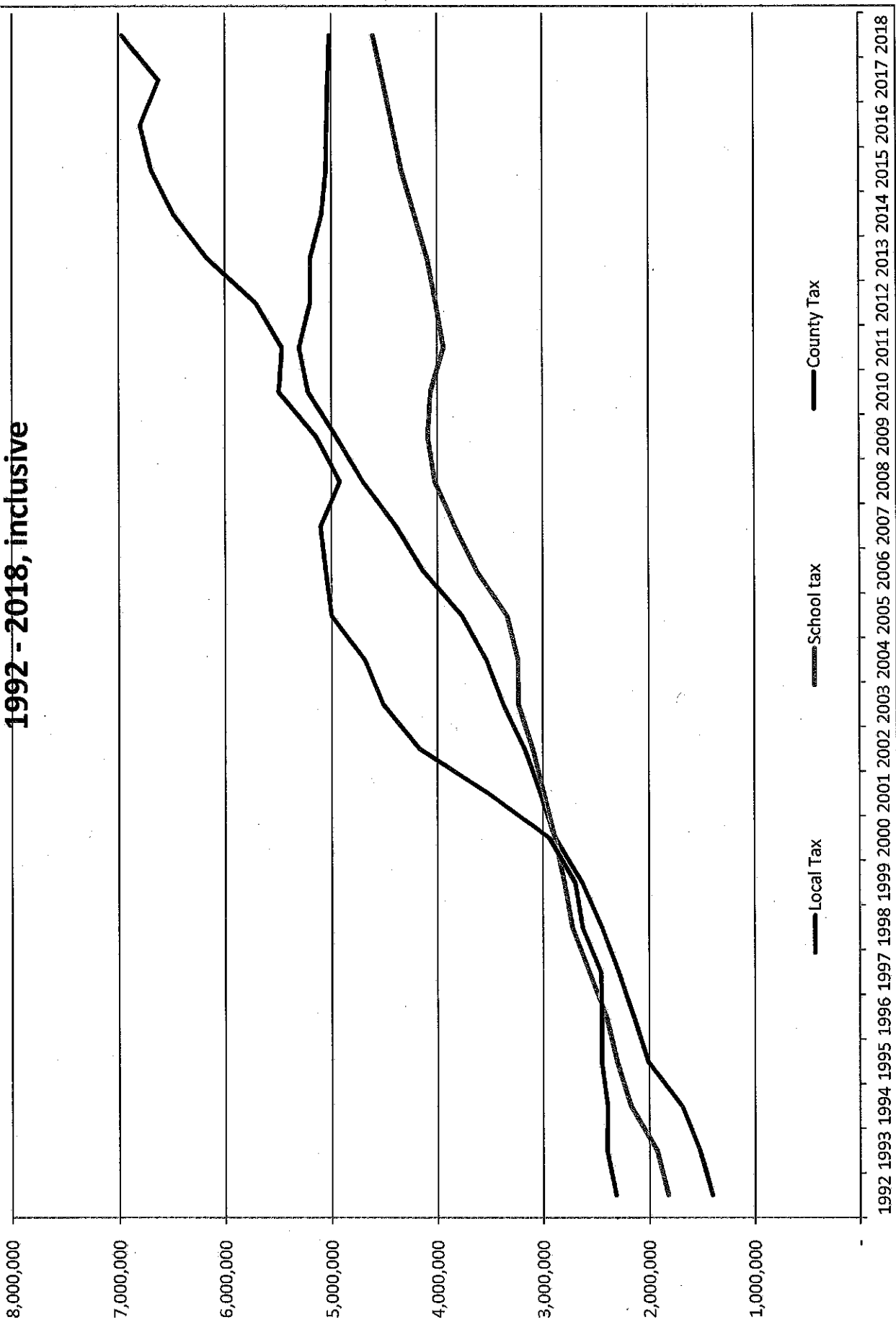
