2. PUBLIC PARTICIPATION ON ANY CONSENT AGENDA ITEM: Mary Lyons, Crescent Parkway, stated that she is in favor of adopting the Proclamation.

3. CONSENT AGENDA - Resolution No. 74-2018: UPON MOTION of Councilman Foley, seconded by Councilwoman Morris, carried, that the following Resolution be and the same is hereby adopted:

- Proclamation Declaring the First Friday in June to be National Gun Violence Awareness Day

WHEREAS, every day, 96 Americans are killed by gun violence and on average there are nearly 13,000 gun homicides every year; and

WHEREAS, Americans are 25 times more likely to be killed with guns than people in other developed countries; and

WHEREAS, protecting public safety in the communities they serve is mayors' highest responsibility; and

WHEREAS, support for the Second Amendment rights of law-abiding citizens goes hand-in-hand with keeping guns away from dangerous people; and

WHEREAS, mayors and law enforcement officers know their communities best, are the most familiar with local criminal activity and how to address it, and are best positioned to understand how to keep their citizens safe; and

WHEREAS, in January 2013, Hadiya Pendleton, a teenager who marched in President Obama's second inaugural parade and was tragically shot and killed just weeks later, should have be now celebrating her 21st birthday; and

WHEREAS, to help honor Hadiya – and the 96 Americans whose lives are cut short and the countless survivors who are injured by shootings every day – a national coalition of organizations has designated June 1, 2018, the first Friday in June, as the 4th National Gun Violence Awareness Day; and

WHEREAS, the idea was inspired by a group of Hadiya's friends, who asked their classmates to commemorate her life by wearing orange; they chose this color because hunters wear orange to announce themselves to other hunters when out in the woods and orange is a color that symbolizes the value of human life; and

WHEREAS, anyone can join this campaign by pledging to Wear Orange on June 1 the first Friday in June in 2018, to help raise awareness about gun violence; and

WHEREAS, by wearing orange on June 1, 2018 Americans will raise awareness about gun violence and honor the lives of gun violence victims and survivors; and

WHEREAS, we renew our commitment to reduce gun violence and pledge to do all we can to keep firearms out of the wrong hands, and encourage responsible gun ownership to help keep our children safe.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Sea Girt declares the first Friday in June, June 1, 2018, to be National Gun Violence Awareness Day, and encourage all citizens to support their local communities' efforts to prevent the tragic effects of gun violence and to honor and value human lives.

A. Ordinance No. 10-2018 – Possible Adoption:

1. The Mayor to read the said Ordinance by Title, advising of its publication in its entirety in the Asbury Park Press on April 29, 2018:

ORDINANCE NO. 10-2018

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER IX, BEACHES, BOARDWALK AND DUNES, SECTION 9-1.2, RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE BOROUGH CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF SEA GIRL, MONMOUTH COUNTY, NEW JERSEY

WHEREAS, Chapter IX, Beaches, Boardwalk and Dunes of the Borough Code governs beach regulations in the Borough of Sea Girt; and,

WHEREAS, the following sections of Chapter IX are amended with additions reflected in **bold underline**;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Mayor and Borough Council of the Borough of Sea Girt in the County of Monmouth and State of New Jersey as follows:

Section 1. Section 9-1.2 is hereby supplemented as follows:

bb. No tents or canopies are permitted, only umbrellas with one central stanchion and a top no larger than six (6 feet) across to provide shade whether upright or at a ninety degree position. Devices designed or used to shade infants, no larger than forty (40”) inches high by forty (40”) inches wide by forty (40”) deep are permitted for infant use only.

Section 3. Repeal, Severability.

a. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are repealed, but only to the extent of such inconsistency.

b. If any section, paragraph, subparagraph, clause or provision of this ordinance shall be adjudged invalid, such adjudication shall apply only to the section, paragraph, subparagraph, clause or provision so adjudged and the remainder of this ordinance shall be deemed valid and effective.

Section 4. Effective Date

This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its final passage and publication as required by law.

A. Ordinances - Introduction

1. **Ordinance No. 11-2018:** The Mayor read the said Ordinance by Title:

ORDINANCE NO. 11-2018

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND AND SUPPLEMENT CHAPTER XXI, STREETS AND SIDEWALKS, ARTICLE 21-4.5, CONSTRUCTION OF DRIVEWAYS IN CRESCENT PARK, DESIGN STANDARDS, OF THE BOROUGH CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF SEA GIRT

Council President Fetzer objected to the proposed apron width of 25 feet; he suggested that the Borough obtain additional information and have the Borough Engineer, Zoning and the Fire Department comment on the proposed Ordinance. Councilwoman Anthony questioned the definition of a road and whether easements exist allowing connection to the road. Councilman Meixsell noted that Zoning and the Fire Department had already supplied comments on this matter.

2. **Ordinance No. 12-2018:** The Mayor read the said Ordinance by Title:

ORDINANCE NO. 12-2018

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND AND SUPPLEMENT CHAPTER VII, TRAFFIC, ARTICLE 7-37 LOADING ZONES AND ARTICLE 7-39, HANDICAPPED PARKING ON STREETS, OF THE BOROUGH CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF SEA GIRT

There were various comments from members of Council regarding components of the proposed Ordinance; after discussion, it was the consensus of Council to introduce the Ordinance at this time. Councilwoman Morris noted that Mrs. Carafa, Chief Davenport and Captain Macko have thought long and hard on the provisions included in this Ordinance; she also stated that if it determined after this summer that this is not an effective solution to the problem, the Ordinance can be amended or revoked.

WHEREAS, the Borough Council of the Borough of Sea Girt has determined that the designation of a loading zone and handicapped parking spot on Ocean Avenue near Beacon Boulevard is necessary to preserve and protect the safety and well-being of the general public.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the Borough of Sea Girt as follows:

SECTION 1. Article 7-37, LOADING ZONES, is hereby amended and supplemented as follows:

The locations described are hereby designated as Loading Zones. No person shall park a vehicle in these locations during the times indicated other than for the loading or unloading of passengers, goods and materials.

SECTION 2. Article 7-39 HANDICAPPED PARKING, is hereby amended and supplemented as follows:

7-39.1 Handicapped Parking on Streets.

In accordance with the provisions of *N.J.S.A. 39:4-197*, the following on street locations are designated as handicapped parking places. Such spaces are for use by persons who have been issued special identification cards or plates or placards by the Motor Vehicle Commission, or a temporary placard issued by the Chief of Police. No other person shall be permitted to park in these spaces. (Ord. No. 567; Ord. No. 861; Ord. No. 13-2010 § 2)

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SECTION 3. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

SECTION 4. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or portion of this ordinance is for any reason held to be invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct, and independent provision, and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions hereof.

3. **Ordinance No. 13-2018:** The Mayor read the said Ordinance by Title:

ORDINANCE NO. 13-2018

BOND ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR VARIOUS 2018 CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS, BY AND IN THE BOROUGH OF SEA GIRT, IN THE COUNTY OF MONMOUTH, STATE OF NEW JERSEY (THE "BOROUGH"); APPROPRIATING \$690,000 THEREFOR AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$683,000 BONDS OR NOTES OF THE BOROUGH TO FINANCE PART OF THE COSTS THEREOF

BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED BY THE BOROUGH COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF SEA GIRT, IN THE COUNTY OF MONMOUTH, STATE OF NEW JERSEY (not less than two-thirds of all the members thereof affirmatively concurring), **AS FOLLOWS:**

SECTION 1. The improvements or purposes described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance are hereby authorized as general improvements or purposes to be undertaken by the Borough of Sea Girt, in the County of Monmouth, State of New Jersey (the "Borough"). For the said improvements or purposes stated in Section 3, there is hereby appropriated the aggregate sum of \$690,000, said sum being inclusive of a down payment in the aggregate amount of \$7,000 for said improvements or purposes as required by the Local Bond Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:2-1 et seq. (the "Local Bond Law"). The down payment is now available by virtue of a provision or provisions in a previously adopted budget or budgets of the Borough for down payment or for capital improvement purposes. Pursuant to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:2-7 and 40A:2-11(c) of the Local Bond Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:2-1 et seq., as amended and supplemented (the "Local Bond Law"), no down payment is required for the Water Utility Improvements set forth in Section 3(a)(v) as the Water Utility of the Borough is self-liquidating.

SECTION 2. For the financing of said improvements or purposes described in Section 3 hereof and to meet the part of said \$690,000 appropriation not provided for by application hereunder of the down payment, negotiable bonds of the Borough are hereby authorized to be issued in the aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$683,000 pursuant to the Local Bond Law. In anticipation of the issuance of said bonds and to temporarily finance said improvements or purposes, negotiable notes of the Borough in an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$683,000 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to and within the limitations prescribed by said Local Bond Law.

SECTION 3. (a) The improvements hereby authorized and purposes for the financing of which said obligations are to be issued include, but are not limited to, as follows:

(b) The aggregate estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes to be issued for said improvements or purposes is \$683,000.

(c) The aggregate estimated cost of said improvements or purposes is \$690,000, the excess amount thereof over the said estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes to be issued therefor is the down payment available for said purposes.

(d) All such improvements or purposes set forth in Section 3(a) shall include, but are not limited to, as applicable, preparation of plans and specifications, permits, bid documents, contract administration, and also shall include all work, materials, equipment, accessories, labor and appurtenances necessary therefor or incidental thereto.

SECTION 4. In the event the United States of America, the State of New Jersey, the County of Monmouth and/or a private entity make a contribution or grant in aid to the Borough for the improvements and purposes authorized hereby and the same shall be received by the Borough prior to the issuance of the bonds or notes authorized in Section 2 hereof, then the amount of such bonds or notes to be issued shall be reduced by the amount so received from the United States of America, the State of New Jersey, the County of Monmouth and/or a private entity. In the event, however, that any amount so contributed or granted by the United States of America, the State of New Jersey, the County of Monmouth and/or a private entity shall be received by the Borough after the issuance of the bonds or notes authorized in Section 2 hereof, then such funds shall be applied to the payment of the bonds or notes so issued and shall be used for no other purpose.

SECTION 5. All bond anticipation notes issued hereunder shall mature at such times as may be determined by the Chief Financial Officer of the Borough, provided that no note shall mature later than one (1) year from its date. The notes shall bear interest at such rate or rates and be in such form as may be

determined by the Chief Financial Officer. The Chief Financial Officer of the Borough shall determine all matters in connection with the notes issued pursuant to this bond ordinance, and the signature of the Chief Financial Officer upon the notes shall be conclusive evidence as to all such determinations. All notes issued hereunder may be renewed from time to time in accordance with the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:2-8.1. The Chief Financial Officer is hereby authorized to sell part or all of the notes from time to time at a public or private sale and to deliver them to the purchaser thereof upon receipt of payment of the purchase price and accrued interest thereon from their dates to the date of delivery thereof. The Chief Financial Officer is directed to report in writing to the governing body at the meeting next succeeding the date when any sale or delivery of the notes pursuant to this bond ordinance is made. Such report must include the principal amount, the description, the interest rate, the maturity schedule of the notes so sold, the price obtained and the name of the purchaser.

SECTION 6. The capital budget of the Borough is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this bond ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith and a resolution in the form promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended capital budget and capital programs as approved by the Director of the Division of Local Government Services, Department of Community Affairs, State of New Jersey, is on file in the Office of the Clerk of the Borough and is available for public inspection.

SECTION 7. The following additional matters are hereby determined, declared, recited and stated:

(a) The purposes described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance are not current expenses and are improvements which the Borough may lawfully undertake as general improvements, and no part of the cost thereof has been or shall be specially assessed on property specially benefited thereby.

(b) The average period of usefulness of said purposes within the limitations of said Local Bond Law, according to the reasonable life thereof computed from the date of the said bonds authorized by this bond ordinance, is 17.77 years.

(c) The supplemental debt statement required by the Local Bond Law has been duly made and filed in the Office of the Clerk of the Borough and a complete executed duplicate thereof has been filed in the Office of the Director of the Division of Local Government Services, Department of Community Affairs, State of New Jersey, and such statement shows that the gross debt of the Borough as defined in the Local Bond Law is increased by the authorization of the bonds or notes provided for in this bond ordinance by \$683,000 and the said obligations authorized by this bond ordinance will be within all debt limitations prescribed by said Local Bond Law.

(d) An aggregate amount not exceeding \$138,000 for items of expense listed in and permitted under N.J.S.A. 40A:2-20 is included in the estimated cost indicated herein for the purposes or improvements herein before described.

SECTION 8. The full faith and credit of the Borough are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and the interest on the obligations authorized by this bond ordinance. The obligations shall be direct, unlimited obligations of the Borough, and the Borough shall be obligated to levy *ad valorem* taxes upon all the taxable property within the Borough for the payment of the principal of the obligations and the interest thereon without limitation as to rate or amount.

SECTION 9. The Borough hereby declares the intent of the Borough to issue the bonds or bond anticipation notes in the amount authorized in Section 2 of this bond ordinance and to use proceeds to pay or reimburse expenditures for the costs of the purposes described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance. This

Section 9 is a declaration of intent within the meaning and for purposes of Treasury Regulations §1.150-2 or any successor provisions of federal income tax law.

SECTION 10. The Borough Chief Financial Officer is hereby authorized to prepare and to update from time to time as necessary a financial disclosure document to be distributed in connection with the sale of obligations of the Borough and to execute such disclosure document on behalf of the Borough. The Borough Chief Financial Officer is further authorized to enter into the appropriate undertaking to provide secondary market disclosure on behalf of the Borough pursuant to Rule 15c2-12 of the Securities and Exchange Commission (the “Rule”) for the benefit of holders and beneficial owners of obligations of the Borough and to amend such undertaking from time to time in connection with any change in law, or interpretation thereof, provided such undertaking is and continues to be, in the opinion of a nationally recognized bond counsel, consistent with the requirements of the Rule. In the event that the Borough fails to comply with its undertaking, the Borough shall not be liable for any monetary damages, and the remedy shall be limited to specific performance of the undertaking.

SECTION 11. The Borough covenants to maintain the exclusion from gross income under Section 103(a) of the Code of the interest on all bonds and notes issued under this bond ordinance.

UPON MOTION of Councilman Foley, seconded by Council President Fetzer, carried, that the preceding Ordinance be and the same is hereby adopted on the first reading, directing the Clerk to post and publish as required by law and setting the date of the public hearing as May 23, 2018.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Chapter XXI, Section 21-4, et seq., of the Borough Code, the Eric and Pamela Anderson, owners of record of Block 9, Lot 3, also known as 653 Ocean Avenue in the Borough of Sea Girt, has made application to the Zoning Official for permission to reconfigure and reconstruct a driveway through Crescent Park; and,

WHEREAS, the application that was submitted is complete in all respects; has been reviewed by the Zoning Official, the Borough Engineer and the Shade Tree Commission and approved by all parties.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Borough Council of the Borough of Sea Girt that the request of the owner of record of Block 9, Lot 3 also known as 653 Ocean Avenue, be and the same is hereby approved.

B. Resolution No. 77- 2018: Designating a Loading Zone on the East Side of Ocean Avenue South of Beacon Boulevard, as amended

Council President Fetzer noted that there is a discrepancy between the provisions of Ordinance No. 12-2018 and paragraph one of this resolution; therefore, the Resolution is being amended to change the starting point of the loading zone from 35 feet to 36 feet.

UPON MOTION of Councilwoman Morris, seconded by Councilman Meixsell, carried, that the following Resolution be and the same is hereby adopted as amended:
